

Lynchburg, Va. Sunday Feb. 19, 1967

Dear Folks,

It is now after three and I am very tired. Must get some sleep before I go back to Pisgah. The ladies have asked him to speak on Foreign Missions. He says he will speak on soul winning but not on Foreign Missions. The reason for his making a statement like that is that the World Missions Board is so tied up with the National Council that he will not speak on the subject of F.M nor give to it. I do not agree with him so the ladies have asked me to follow up his talk on Soul Winning with a talk on Foreign Missions. I do not like the tie up but will not cease to speak of and support F.M.

We had a sleet on Thursday night which made the traveling very dangerous. Then that was followed by about 5 inches more of snow. That did make traveling dangerous. I spent five dollars again to get my drive plowed out again. We have certainly had a lot of snow. I phone out to Pisgah and asked them to get the church yard plowed out. One of my members rose to the occasion and did it. It was not, however, very thoroughly done. That cut down our congregation to about 34. Several of them have told me that they could not understand Revelation. That prompted me to speak on that wonderful book of the Bible. I did not get as far this morning as I had intended so will take two more bites at it.

Dr. Crowe came out to see George yesterday. First time he had seen him. I laid in a little more food so that I could feed him. Up until yesterday he would not take anything but beef broth. Last night one of the ladies in the church sent him over some food which he enjoyed very much. He was getting tired of what I tried to fix him. I can't cook for well people much less for sick.

Yesterday we had a meeting of our school board at the restaurant to meet our principal and his wife. They came up from Orangeburg S.C. and of course he had no snow tires. When he hit the snow this side of Danville the children were much excited. That seems to be the main reason they want to move here. It was the first they had ever seen in their lives. I like Mr. Gilliam and Mrs. Gilliam very much. He is a Ph.D. in Psychology from Bob Jones University. Jerry announced that the real estate men had told him the the prices of land in the Boonsboro section have gone up. If the Lord carries that will mean something in a pecuniary way to you, my children. I will not think of selling my self and I hope the prices stay up. I do not think any of us are going to need such things long. Now I must not be making these letters too long. It is too easy for you to throw them in the waste basket.

I expect to go down down in the morning and make a plane reservation to Tampa, Florida. That will be for Monday, March 27. Hope I can get a reservation at Souther Keswick. I would like to write more but will help you by not using the rest of this sheet. Devotedly,
